This Christmas we will again be joined by players from the hugely popular **Hutt City Brass**, with director Matthew Stein. We are delighted that our choir will be **Marsden Collegiate School's premier choir, Altissimo,** with director Maaike Christie-Beekman. The Friends are thrilled to announce that **Old St Paul's original tenor bronze bell** is now on display in the belfry porch. Sent away for repairs in 1940, the tenor bell has been on a long, diverse journey.

For some years it served as the school bell for Kuranui College in the Wairarapa. On its return to Wellington it hung in front of St Barnabas, Khandallah, where it proved irresistible to passing locals and was eventually damaged and threatened with burial as a judder bar.

Fortunately, the bell was tracked down and rescued by a determined trio: Jane Aim, Terry Barrett, and Janet Raphael. It then underwent some years of restoration by former National Museum conservator Jack Fry.







What Jack achieved was amazing, as you can see from before and after pictures!

Last Friday morning the bell was welcomed back to the Church and the new exhibition blessed by Kaumatua Peter Jackson.

The bell is the only one surviving from a set of three that were installed in the Church in 1887.

Looking ahead to 2024, the Friends' AGM will be on Tuesday 19 March, starting at 5.30 pm.

We are delighted that **our speaker will be well-known writer and historian Kate Fortune** from the Friends of Bolton Street Cemetery. Many early Wellingtonians and parishioners of Old St Paul's lie in the Bolton Street Cemetery, so come along to hear some fascinating stories and enjoy a glass of wine with us.
