Bolton Street Cemetery

We look forward to welcoming you to the Friends AGM on Tuesday 19 March, at 5.30pm in Old St Paul's Church, Mulgrave Street, Thorndon. The Notice of Meeting/Agenda is attached to this

newsletter. We are delighted that our guest speaker will be Kate Fortune, of the Friends of Bolton Street cemetery, now known as the Bolton Street Memorial Park.

Many Old St Paul's early parishioners lie in Bolton Street. Set aside by the New Zealand Company in 1840 in Wellington's initial town plan, Bolton Street is the city's oldest cemetery. The first burials took place in 1841. Fifty years later it was almost full, and a new public cemetery opened in Karori in 1891.

**Come and hear Kate talk about early cemetery inhabitants and their links with Old St Paul's**, then join us for a glass of wine.
